As the members of New Mount Pilgrim Missionary Baptist Church celebrated another year in the West Garfield community, we also reflected upon the history of New Mount Pilgrim Missionary Baptist Church.

It all begin on May 19, 1950 when a organizational meeting was held at 1150 W. Lake Street. Rev. J.H. Johnson was elected first Pastor by members present at the organizational meeting: Bro James R. McCoy, Bro. L.H. Hunt, Sis. Williamson, Bro. A.D. Simmons, Sis. Alice Johnson, Rev. Alonzo Smith, Bro. Albert Taylor, Sis. Carrie Taylor, Bro. Elex Taylor, Sis. Eloise Taylor, Bro. Nathaniel Douglas and Sis. Nancy Douglas.

1957 moved to 1740 W. Madison

1963 moved to 2708 W. Washington— Rev. Johnson resigned and Rev. George Henry Smith was elected Pastor

1965 moved to 3332 W. Fifth Avenue—Rev. Smith resigned

April 1993 moved to 4301 W. Washington Blvd.

May 1993 Pastor McCoy call home to be with the Lord after leading NMP for 28 years.

September 1993 Rev. Marshall E. Hatch was elected fourth Pastor, increasing membership to over 700 active members.

1994 a \$200,000 purchase of the church building and parking properties was obtained

1996 a \$65,000 project to build and equip a commercial

kitchen facility, women's washrooms and fellowship hall remodeling

1998 mortgage was paid off—Hallelujah! Renovation Phase I completions: North Window, Pulpit/Electric, Padding Pews, Carpeting, A/C in Fellowship Hall

1999 Renovation Phase II completions: Roofing Work, Ladies Washroom, and Choir Loft Extension

2000 Renovation Phase III completions Central Air in Sanctuary and "MAAFA Remembrance" East Window, "Pilgrim Village" realized,

The boys chose the upstairs bedrooms and the girls settled down stairs. They managed to see the entire cabin, get unpacked and ready for snacks with the hour. The place where we were supposed to eat was approximately 50 feet away, in the dark, which was pretty scary. The flashlights came in handy.

Rev. Jackson blessed our meal; we ate and went to the Chapel. The Chapel was beautiful. The walls were covered with different "banners". The banners used words and or pictures to tell the story of Christ. They were awesome. We spent several hours in the chapel discussing the banners. The children

were encouraged to tell their interpretation of each. It was interesting to hear them explain what the banners meant, their interpretations of the banners were very thought provoking and insightful.

After the Chapel time, we were back in our rooms getting ready for the next day. The sun rose over a beautiful lake. Across the lake were beautiful homes scattered upon the hills. Driving into the campsite in the dark camouflaged the majestic beauty of the property. Our day began with Breakfast, after which we were back in the Chapel where the purpose of the retreat was explained. The purpose was to teach the children how to apply God's word to their lives. It was intended to teach them to be doers of the word not just hearers.

After the class sessions, there was lunch. It was at lunch that you were able to witness new relationships developing between the children. Those that

were sort of quiet were now holding conversations. Those that were a little standoffish were blossoming into social butterflies. It truly was an awesome experience to witness such transformations.

After lunch we headed back to the chapel. This time we had a "traditional" service. We had praise and worship, we had devotion, we had prayer and we had testimonies from the children that lasted for hours.

It was our experience during this winter retreat that chains were broken. These children were set free from their shackles that bind them everyday. They were allowed to play and run. They were encouraged to speak their minds and express how they feel. Above all they were challenged to take God's word seriously, and learn to apply it to their lives everyday, not just on Sunday.

Sis Ervin gives her personal testimony: "My personal testimony is and will always begin with *God is good*. As I stated above, I was introduced to Christ by my grandmother when I was six years old. My grandmother kept me and my brother in church faithfully until her death in 1990. After she passed away, I continued to go to church for the next year. I was 12-years-old when I

decided to stop going to church. I grew up in a single parent home where my mom was the bread winner. Growing up without my father in my life was very difficult. What I know now that I didn't know then, is that God will be a father to the fatherless. My mom worked extremely hard to support our family of three. Once in high school, overwhelmed with peer pressure and low self-esteem I conceived my first child at the age of 16. Young and caring for a child, I was ashamed of how people would look at me. What I know now is that we shouldn't be ashamed or embarrassed by our past, but to learn from our mistakes and encourage others not to make those same mistakes. Not only was I growing up without a father, I soon learned that my three-month-old daughter, at that time would do the same. But to God be the glory she never went

without. Now, not only was my mother supporting my brother and me, she was now helping me support my daughter. As of this day, I continue to thank God for my mother.
